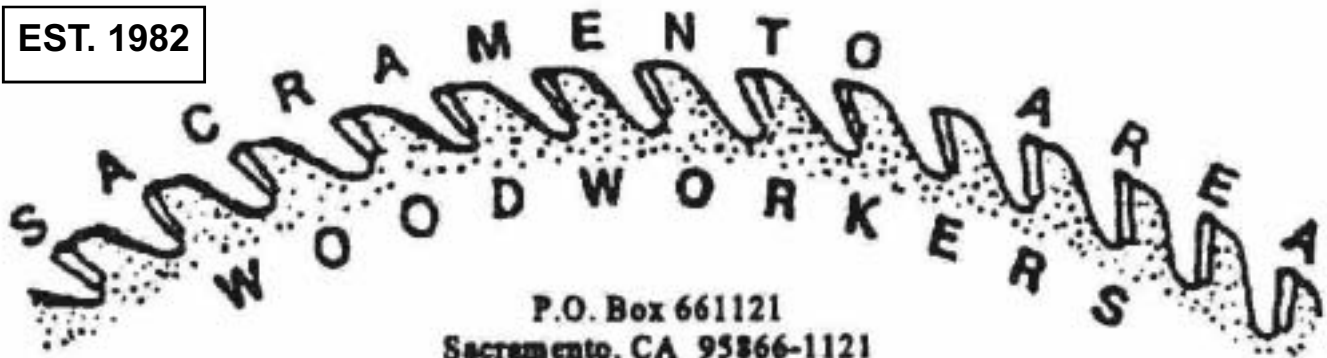

The Furniture SIG met on Sunday November 12th at Dave Wilson's shop. Four members attended. Dave was showing how to bend "Solid Wood" with steam. Also he showed how to bend wood by stacking thin strips (approx 1/8" thick) together with glue and clamps only. (no steam is used in this laminate method). This bending method is usually used to make chairs. Dave has many forms for bending the wood as well as a metal bending fixture. He uses the metal fixture to bend steamed wood around a form. Also a special table is used with pegs & wedges. Dave has made many chairs and had pictures of these to show. The meeting ended at 3 p.m. and all members had a great time. Thank you Dave Wilson.
