Don started with a small sled for cutting tenons, showing a fast and easy way to make the shoulders on the tenon with a Dado blade mounted in the Table Saw. This was followed by a hands-on demo using a router to cut mortises. The group had many questions for Don to answer.


The April Novice SIG was cancelled due to the conflict with the Cal Expo woodworking show.


